Two variable frequency drives at the Hershey Road pump station were damaged due to fluctuations in incoming power. Both units have been replaced and are back in operation.

VARIABLE FREQUENCY DRIVES DAMAGED

Mitchell was pleased to announce that a total of \$79,000 has been generated through the sale of old unused equipment. This income will offset nearly the entire price of the new vacuum pump expected to arrive in approximately 2 weeks.

Mitchell asked for consideration in purchasing a backup pump for Moore Road well #3 to be used in the event of equipment failure.

Motion by Stevens, seconded by Lacey, authorizing the purchase of a 6" 500 GPM Berkley pump and motor from Rindfuss Drilling at a cost of \$14,347.00.

Further, approval is given to consolidate all of the Authority's loans into a new loan at FNB pending Board member Lacey's favorable review.
